Anticipation/Reaction Guide - Reading Educator

The Anticipation/Reaction Guide helps students activate and evaluate prior knowledge. Students make predictions based upon background knowledge and evaluate these predictions after exposure to new information. (H.L. Herber, 1978) Follow these steps to create an Anticipation/Reaction Guide:

Page 10: Introduction to Anticipation-Reaction Guide. One strategy teachers can use to help students document textual evidence while acknowledging multiple perspectives is the Anticipation-Reaction Guide. The reaction portion of an anticipation-reaction guide activity requires students to come to final conclusions about what the text actually states as the answer to the questions provided on the anticipation-reaction guide. Students get to ask themselves questions such as, "Did I guess right?" "Was my initial guess confirmed?"

Anticipation-Reaction Guides

Anticipation/Reaction Guides set a purpose for reading: to accept, reject, or modify attitudes and schema (prior knowledge) during reading. Anticipation/Reaction Guides encourage students to interact with the author while thinking about issues and ideas. Teachers may use an Anticipation/Reaction Guide to assess class knowledge before they begin a thematic unit or lesson.

An anticipation guide is a comprehension strategy that is used before reading to activate students' prior knowledge and build curiosity about a new topic. Before reading, students listen to or read several statements about key concepts presented in the text; they're often structured as a series of statements with which the students can choose to agree or disagree.
