Over the course of fewer than 50 years, the U.S. conducted at least 1,054 nuclear weapons tests. The U.S. Army alone detonated at least 1,149 atomic devices, nearly every one of them on American soil, and nine out of 10 of them specifically in the deserts of Nevada. The effects of nuclear testing have been staggering.

Introduction During the Cold War in the mid-1940s through early 1960s, the U.S. government conducted about 100 nuclear weapons (atomic bomb) tests in the atmosphere at a test site in Nevada, more than 100 in the Pacific, and one—the first ever—in New Mexico. The radioactive substances released by these tests are known as “fallout.”
