The second phase in the development of group structure is labeled as intragroup conflict. Group members become hostile toward one another and toward a therapist or trainer as a means of expressing their individuality and resisting the formation of group structure. Interaction is uneven and `infighting' is common.

In the social realm, these stages in the developmental sequence are testing-dependence, conflict, cohesion, and functional roles. In the task realm, they are orientation, emotionality, relevant opinion exchange, and the emergence of solutions.

Developmental Sequence in Small Groups describes an initial phase of working through of hostility,' followed by a stage of Working through of anxieties'. The hostility phase is characterized by disruption and fragmentation which are reduced gradually in the anxiety phase.

Over a ten-week period, Lacoursiere observed four stages of group development: 1. Orientation, characterized by fears and anxieties and fairly strong positive expectations; 2. Dissatisfaction, characterized by an increasing sense of frustration, along with depression and anger; 3.

Stages of Small-Group Development Revisited

The four stages of developmental sequence in small groups, discussed in chapter 46, include forming, storming, norming, and performing. Later, a fifth stage was added: adjourning (Bonebright, 2010).

Rickards and Moger proposed a similar extension to the Tuckman model when a group breaks out of its norms through a process of creative problem-solving. John Fairhurst TPR model. Alasdair A. K. White together with his colleague, John Fairhurst, examined Tuckman's development sequence when developing the White-Fairhurst TPR model. They simplify the sequence and group the forming-storming-norming stages together as the "transforming" phase, which they equate with the initial performance level.

In 1965 Dr. Bruce Tuckman published an article titled “ Developmental Sequence in Small Groups ” where he focused on the interpersonal relationships of the group members and the impact on task activities (Bonebright, 2009). Within that article, Tuckman hypothesized the stages of group development now known as Tuckman’s Model.

The goal of most research on group development is to learn why and how small groups change over time. To do this, researchers examine patterns of change and continuity in groups over time. Aspects of a group that might be studied include the quality of the output produced by a group, the type and frequency of its activities, its cohesiveness, the existence of group conflict .
