Developmentally Appropriate Practice in Early Childhood ...

Developmentally Appropriate Practice (also known as DAP) is a teaching perspective in early childhood education where a teacher nurtures a child's development (social, emotional, physical, and cognitive) based on the following: theories of child development; what is individually important uncovered through assessment; the child's cultural background (community, family history, and family structure).

Demonstrate the correct way to do something. This usually involves a procedure that needs to be done in a certain way (such as using a wire whisk or writing the letter P). Create or add challenge so that a task goes a bit beyond what the children can already do.

DAP comes from a deep history in early education, research, and what many describe as "good thinking.". NAEYC (National Association for the Education of Young Children) states, "Developmentally Appropriate Practice is informed by what we know from theory and literature about how children develop and learn."

Developmentally appropriate practice, often shortened to DAP, is an approach to teaching grounded both in the research on how young children develop and learn and in what is known about effective early education. DAP - wherein teachers and staff base all practices and decisions with the goal of nurturing students' social/emotional, physical, and cognitive development - is a keystone for the establishment of safe supportive learning environments for young children.
