Section 4: Colonial Period and Independence. In adopting the Declaration of Independence and US Constitution, the American Founding Fathers built on and expanded traditions of liberty they had learned from their experience as English colonists and settlers. The Articles of Confederation, their first attempt at a post-British government, proved incapable of successfully structuring the United States, which required replacement of the Articles by the U.S. Constitution in 1787.

1492 - Christopher Columbus makes his first voyage and discovers America. 1585 - The Roanoke Colony is founded. It will disappear and become known as the "Lost Colony." 1607 - The Jamestown Settlement is established. 1609 - Only 60 out of 500 settlers in Jamestown survive the winter of 1609-1610. It is called the "Starving Time."
