Manual Eject Imac

Some Apple keyboards have an eject key, usually located in the upper right corner of the keyboard. Press the Eject key to eject the CD or DVD from the drive. On any keyboard, including those originally designed for use with a Windows PC, press and hold the F12 key until the CD or DVD is ejected from the drive. This may take several seconds.

How Do I Eject a CD or DVD From My Mac?

Press the Eject Button Press the Eject button on the keyboard. Click the Eject Icon Click on the Eject symbol on the menu bar at the top, then select the name of the disc drive.

If you can restart your computer to eject the disc: Choose Apple menu > Restart, then click Restart while pressing and holding the mouse or trackpad button until the disc is ejected. You can also hold the Option key while restarting your Mac. When you see your CD or DVD appear on the screen, select it, then press the Eject key.

Press your Mac's  Eject button. This key is in the top-right corner of your Mac's keyboard. If the CD tray/slot is working correctly, the disk should slide right out. The disk may take a few seconds to eject if you were using it immediately before pressing the Eject button.

On your Mac, choose Apple menu > Log Out, then log in again. Try to eject the disc again. If you still can't eject the CD or DVD, choose Apple menu > Restart. While your computer restarts, press and hold the mouse or trackpad button until the disc is ejected.

If you can't eject a disk from Mac - Apple Support

Hold down your trackpad button (or your left mouse button) and restart your Mac. Hold the button down until the desktop appears. This will trigger the system to eject your disc before OS X begins loading. Shut down the Mac and restart it, then let it sit for 15 minutes.

ForceEject is a tiny little tool of about 100KB that simply does what is intended and tries to force your Superdrive to eject its stuck optical disc. To use the ForceEject Tool, download and run it and an icon will appear on your menu bar. Click on the icon to popup a menu and either select to eject an internal or external SuperDrive.

Your first stop will be Disk Utility, located at /Applications/Utilites/Disk Utility.app. Find your disc in the left sidebar and click the eject button up top, or right-click on the disc and select the eject command. You can also eject using OS X's Disk Utility.

Quick Tip: How to Force Eject a Stuck Disc

Try launching the Terminal program (in the Utilities folder, which is in the Applications folder) and typing this in: `drutil eject -drive internal` and then press Return on the keyboard. That will tell the Mac to try to eject the disc from the internal drive.
